

Weaver birds are noted for their nest-building techniques. They masterfully weave a nest out of grass stems and other plant fibres. With a strong, conical beak, the weaverbird cuts blades of grass, then using these blades, it can tie real knots with its beak and feet. This knot-tying makes the nest more secure. They live in tropical regions of Asia and Africa, in the forest, swamps, steppes and savannas. Weaver birds range

from about 4.5 to 10 inches long. Males are often yellow and black. While females tend to be brown and buff-coloured. They are omnivorous, and mostly eat insects and seeds. Some weaver birds of Africa build communal nests, instead of individuals, which can fill up an entire tree canopy and may last for 100 years.
